HISTORY of JONES COUNTY, IOWA

JONES COUNTY IN WAR

Men in Jones county fought in 4 of the 6 great wars in which this country was engaged. They were the Mexican war, the Civil war, the Spanish-American war, and the World war.

Some of the Pioneers of the county took Part in the war of 1812. C.P. HUTTON, the first supervisor of Jones county, is said to have been a soldier in that conflict, and no doubt but there were many others.

Iowa was a territory when the Mexican war began. The history of that Period says but little in regard to the part the sons of Jones county took in the war, but no doubt some of them saw service in the great struggle.

President POLK made a call, June 1, 1846, for 50,000 volunteers and ordered Governor CLARK, of the Iowa territory, to furnish a regiment. The call was responded to with great enthusiasm, and 26 days after the call was made, the Governor of the territory of Iowa announced to the war department that 12 companies had been enlisted and were ready to respond to a call to service. Two companies were raised in Lee county, 2 in VanBuren, 2 in DesMoines, and 1 company in each of the following counties: Dubuque, Muscatine, Johnson, Louise, Washington and Linn. The men waited for the call all through the summer. On November 25, 1846, Governor CLARK was notified that the regiment would not be needed, and the regimental organization was disbanded.

Iowa had 2 organizations in the war, one was raised at Fort Madison by Captain EDWARD GUTHRIE and F.D. MILLS. It became Company K. of the 15th infantry of the regular army, and participated in many battles. MILLS attained the rank of Major and was killed at Cherubusco, Mexico. The other organization was the Mormon Battalion. When the Mormons were at Mt. Pisgah and Kanesville, Captain ALLEN of the regular army, visited BRIGHAM YOUNG, and with the help of the Mormon leader, organized a Mormon battalion of 500 men. The Mormons went to Ft. Leavenworth and from there they marched under the command of GENERAL KEARNEY to California and assisted in the driving the Mexican forces out of that state.

No doubt but some of the young men of Jones county enlisted in the regular army, as recruiting officers were stationed at every western fort.

In the Civil War the sons of Jones county, made a record for Patriotism and courage seldom or never equaled. The period from 1850 to 1860 was not a prosperous one for the residents of this county, due partly to the distance to market and partly to the low price of farm products. It required a large sum of money to erect buildings, purchase farm equipment, and bring the soil under cultivation. While many cabin homes had dotted the prairies, and the Pioneers were full of hope, the breaking out of the Civil War was a terrible blow to them, because it called the men from the plow where they were badly needed.

The men of Jones county responded to the first call for troops, and a stream of men poured forth to the battle front until the Confederate flag was furled. Jones county furnished men for nearly every military organization formed in Iowa, and for several organizations of other states. So patriotic were the sons of Jones county, that only one draft was held during the entire war and only 45 men were secured by draft.

The Civil War was one of the bloodiest and most destructive wars that had been fought up to that time, and many a brave Jones county boy fell on the crimson fields of the southland.

At the beginning of the war, Iowa had 150,000 men eligible for

military duty, and more than 80,000 of them took part in the great conflict.

The story of the war meetings, the music, the speeches, the parades, the enlistments, the going out of men by ones, twos, three, by companies, battallions and regiments, and the return of the wounded, and the bringing back of the remains of those who had fallen, is a theme for the author, the poet and the orator.
