Passing of a Pioneer

1934

Hannah L. Simpson, daughter of Lawrence and Hannah Simpson, was born in Hale Township, Jones county, Iowa, on June 6, 1849, and died at her home in Olin, Iowa, on Feb. 14, 1934, at the age of 84 years, 8 months and 8 days.

When she was five years old her mother died, leaving Hannah and her brother to the care of their father.

Her brother enlisted in the Civil War as a member of Co. 31, Iowa infantry, but was taken sick and died in camp at Davenport, Iowa.

Her father died in the year 1889, leaving her the only surviving member of the family.

On June 2, 1891, she was united in marriage with B. F. Green, a friend of her girlhood days. After her marriage, they lived in Kansas City for two years, when they came back to Oxford Mills until 1903, when they moved to Olin, where she made her home until the time of her death.

Her husband died at their home in Olin, April 8, 1917.

Mrs. Green was the last of her family which was one of the pioneer families of Jones county. She, herself, was born in a log cabin, and knew the privations and sufferings of a pioneer life in the early days of the middle west.

She leaves to mourn her passing a few cousins and a host of friends.

The funeral services were held Thursday afternoon in the United Brethren church, conducted by the Rev. Lloyd Dutro, pastor of the church, and the body was laid to rest beside her husband in the Olin cemetery.

The funeral services of William E Slagel of Adams Co IA was held at the Christian church in Martelle IA on Monday Sept. 29th followed by interment in the Norwich cemetery. G. Lolin Eaton, pastor of the Christian officiating. William E Slagel was born in Butler Co., PA. Jan 13 1858, and died at Clarinda IA Sept 26 1913, aged 75 years 8 months and 13 days. He came to Jones Co IA with his parents in 1855, where they lived on a farm for four years, removing to Richardson Co NE in 1859. In 1864 he enlisted in Co E Kansas Calvary and served until the close of the war. He was married to Mrs. Lucius J Parker, Aug. 16 1866. To this union were born five children, four daughters and one son, Anna E., William C. and Adah C., deceased, and Mrs. Minnie McConaughy and Adelia L. who with his wife, three brothers and one grandchild, survive him. Mr. Slagel united with the Baptist church at Salem NE in 1870 and later transferred his membership to Corning IA. He was a resident of Adams Co IA for 42 years where he leaves many friends to mourn his departure.

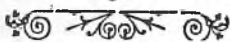

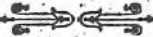

DEATH OF MRS. STRICKEL.

Grace Williams Strickel was born in Cambourne, England, October 28, 1849. She was the daughter of Henry O. and Elizabeth Bray Williams. When she was only a year old, in 1850, she was brought to America by her parents who came here to make their home, settling first in Elizabeth, Illinois.

Living here but a short time, they moved to the copper regions in northern Michigan. After a short time they moved back to Illinois settling on a farm in the vicinity of Woodbine. Here the daughter grew to young womanhood and here she was married, August 28, 1876, to James Strickel. She and her husband continued to live in the neighborhood of Woodbine until September, 1882. They then moved to Iowa, settling in the neighborhood of Stone City.

In September, 1892, they moved to Anamosa and have lived here ever since. In her early youth, Mrs. Strickel united with the Methodist Episcopal church. She retained her membership while at Stone City, there being no protestant church to which she could transfer. On removing to Anamosa, she attended a meeting held in a tent by a representative of the Disciples church, was immersed and united with that body. The local organization lasted about a year and then in 1894, she, together with her husband, united with the Congregational church of this city of which church she was a member at the time of her death.

Her health began failing some two years ago after the death of her daughter, Frances. The severe illness which resulted in her death began about two months ago. She passed quietly away Friday, February 13, 1925, aged 75 years, 8 months and 16 days.

There were born to her twelve children, six boys and six girls. Five of these children, four girls and one boy, have passed to the life beyond. Those remaining to mourn her loss are Martha A. now Mrs. Schroeder of Central City; James H. of Marion; John W. and Charles E. of Anamosa; Robert W. of Rowley; Amos A. of Tipton; Mary G. at home. She is also survived by her husband and by one grandchild, Charline Strickel, also by three brothers and two sisters, Elizabeth Jane Bray of Westfield; John T. Williams and Frances Williams of Elizabeth, Illinois; Henry Williams and James Williams of Stockton, Illinois.

Mrs. Strickel was a kindly, sympathetic and unselfish woman, very much a home body, loving and devoted to her children and her husband, being in turn loved and revered by them. She tried earnestly to do her duty to follow the Christ.

Funeral services were conducted at the Congregational church Monday afternoon by Rev. Ernest Evans. Interment was in the family lot at Riverside.
